ATHLETICS REGULATIONS

TIME AND PLACE

Date: From May 22 to May 23, 2026.

Venue: Stadium “Daugava”

Address: Augšciela 1, Rīga, LV-1009, Latvija

1. PARTICIPANTS

1.1. The athletics competition will be held as individual competitions

1.2 An athlete may participate in a maximum of two individual events and one relay event; however, no more than three athletes per team may be entered in any single event.

2. PROGRAM

May 22 (Friday) – 11:00

May 23 (Saturday) – 11:00

2.1. The following disciplines will be contested in the athletics competition:

Woman: 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1500 m, 3000 m, 100 m hurdles, 4x100 m relay, high jump, long jump, triple jump, shot put, javelin throw, discus.

Men: 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1500 m, 5000 m, 110 m hurdles, 4x100 m relay, high jump, long jump, triple jump, shot put, javelin and discus throw.

2.2 All competing participants must meet the requirements of the General Regulations of SELL 2026.

3. MEDICAL SERVICE

3.1 The participants must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel and participation, as they are not the responsibility of the OC.

3.2. The OC will insure the first aid at the competition venues for all accredited persons.

4. DOPING CONTROL

4.1. Competitors may be subject to doping control in accordance with **World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA)** regulations

5.CODE OF ETHICS

5.1. All sport event organizers participating in the SELL Student Games 2026 are required to formally include and apply the **SELL Student Games Code of Ethics** (Annex 1) within their competition regulations.

5.2. Compliance with the Code of Ethics is mandatory and constitutes a condition for the approval, organization, and conduct of competitions held under the SELL Student Games framework.

5.3. Compliance with the Code of Ethics is mandatory for **all participants** of the SELL Student Games.

SELL STUDENT GAMES Code of Ethics

1. Purpose and Scope

1.1. The SELL Student Games 2026 sport competitions shall be conducted in accordance with the highest ethical standards of international university sport, as defined by the principles of the FISU Code of Ethics.

1.2. This Code of Ethics applies to all participants and stakeholders of the SELL Student Games 2026, including but not limited to athletes, team officials, coaches, referees, judges, volunteers, organizers, medical staff, and accredited persons.

1.3. All persons bound by this Code are required to respect, protect, and promote the values of university sport and fair competition.

2. Fundamental Ethical Principles

All participants shall act in accordance with the following fundamental principles:

- **Integrity and honesty** in all sporting and organizational activities
- **Fair play** and respect for the rules of sport
- **Respect for human dignity**, diversity, and equality
- **Responsibility and accountability** for one's actions
- **Solidarity and educational values** of student sport

3. Respect, Equality, and Non-Discrimination

3.1. Any form of discrimination, harassment, abuse, or exclusion based on gender, age, nationality, ethnicity, race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, political opinion, or any other status is strictly prohibited.

3.2. All participants shall treat others with respect, courtesy, and fairness, both on and off the field of play.

3.3. Psychological, physical, sexual, or moral harassment or abuse shall not be tolerated under any circumstances.

4. Integrity of Sport and Fair Competition

- 4.1. Participants shall respect the rules of competition and the decisions of officials.
- 4.2. Any form of cheating, manipulation of competitions, match-fixing, or improper influence on sporting results is strictly forbidden.
- 4.3. Corruption, bribery, or acceptance of any undue advantage related to sporting performance or event organization is prohibited.

5. Anti-Doping and Health Protection

- 5.1. The use of prohibited substances or methods, as defined by applicable anti-doping regulations, is strictly prohibited.
- 5.2. Participants shall cooperate fully with any doping control procedures conducted during the Games.
- 5.3. The physical and mental health, safety, and well-being of student-athletes shall be a priority at all times.

6. Conflicts of Interest

- 6.1. All persons involved in the SELL Student Games 2026 shall avoid any situation that may lead to a conflict between personal interests and the interests of the competition.
- 6.2. Any actual or potential conflict of interest must be disclosed promptly to the relevant organizing or governing body.

7. Conduct and Representation

- 7.1. Participants shall behave in a manner that upholds the reputation and dignity of the SELL Student Games, FISU, national university sport federations, and their respective institutions.
- 7.2. Unsporting conduct, abusive language, violence, or public statements that damage the image of university sport are prohibited.
- 7.3. The responsible use of media and social media is expected, with respect for ethical standards and the rights of others.

8. Compliance and Sanctions

8.1. Any violation of this Code of Ethics may result in disciplinary measures, in accordance with the SELL Student Games Regulations and applicable FISU and national federation rules.

8.2. Sanctions may include warnings, disqualification, suspension, withdrawal of accreditation, or other appropriate measures.

8.3. Ignorance of this Code does not exempt any person from responsibility.

9. Acceptance of the Code

9.1. Participation in the SELL Student Games 2026 implies full acceptance of and compliance with this Code of Ethics.

9.2. All accredited persons are expected to actively contribute to an ethical, respectful, and educational sporting environment.
